NOW if I the said Blagrove Glenn or my heirs Ex<sup>r</sup> adm<sup>r</sup> or any of us do & shall well and truly pay or comply (or cause it so to be done) with the Bond given to the above mentioned ordinary in order that the said Sylvanus Walker may be relieved of my Securityship of one thousand Dollars on by the fifteenth day of March Eighteen hundred and Eleven, when the said W<sup>m</sup> Brooks becomes of age for the Redemption of the negroes &c, then this present writing to be void but if default be made in the above Guardianship or bond of one thousand dollars that sd Walker is Security to the above court of Ordinary that then it shall remain in force of law. Beginning on a white oak thence S 32. W to a gum thence S 58. W E 25 Chain to a stake thence N 32. E 40. C. to stake thence N 58. W 25 chain to a white walnut thence a bearing on conditional line thence to a red oak thence to a W. Oak thence to Oil Camp Creek thence down the said creek to a black gum thence to a chestnut thence to a black oak thence to a stake thence N 58. W to an oak thence to hornbeam thence to a hickory thence to a hickory thence to the Beginning. to contain three hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To Have and To Hold all and singular the above mentioned premises unto the said Jonathan Potts his heirs and assigns and I do hereby bind myself my heirs and assigns to warrant and defend the same from me my heirs and assigns and from every person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof Witness my hand & seal this 13<sup>th</sup> day January 1809.
