

Sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Thomas Benson in trust for the said Jane Chambers & her heirs tracts or parcels of land containing fifty five acres more or less, and bounded as followeth (Viz) one of thirty acres situated in said District, on the branches of Enoree River, Beginning on a red oak a conditional line made between W^m Chambers & Lewis Linneth thence along a blaze line made between the same to the mountain path corner on a stroke made between W^m Chambers & James Krellhorn thence with said path to a chestnut made between the said W^m Chambers & William Tubb from thence to a post oak on the head of Cattail branch W^m White's corner thence to the Beginning which land was conveyed from W^m Chambers unto the said Robert Benson, also one other tract lying in said State and District conveyed from James Tubb to Robert Benson containing thirty five acres more or less, & bounded as followeth (Viz) Beginning on a white oak on the branch between Lewis Linneth & Lewis William Chambers, thence down the said branch to the fork thence up the little branch to the old original line thence with said old line to a post oak corner thence to a red oak corner thence with the old line to a conditional line thence with said conditional line to the Beginning, containing in both tracts sixty five acres more or less. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances to the said Thomas Benson Trustee for the said Jane Chambers their heirs forever, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs &c. to warrant and forever defend the above described land for the use & purpose unto the said Thomas Benson from me & my heirs lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
