State of South Carolina. Know all men by these presents that I John Tubb
 of Greenville District and State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of
 Five hundred dollars to me in hand paid by John McPherson of the District aforesaid
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, Have granted bargained sold and released
 and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said John McPherson
 his heirs or assigns forever, Two Tracts of Land containing in the whole Three hundred
 and Thirty six acres more or less. Situate in Greenville District aforesaid, on both
 sides of Neal's fork of Tyger River, including the plantation whereon said Tubbs now
 lives, Beginning on a red oak on the north east side of said fork, thence North thirty
 degrees west five chains fifty links to a stake, thence North sixty five degrees
 East six chains twenty links to a hickory shrub, thence North Twenty five degrees
 west 65 chains to a sassafras, thence South seventy seven degrees west twenty three
 chains forty links to a stake, thence twenty degrees East five chains to a Poplar, thence twenty
 degrees west nineteen chains fifty links to a spanish oak, thence South two degrees west
 fourteen chains to a white oak, thence South two degrees East ten chains to a stake
 near a chestnut corner, of the lower tract thence from the chestnut corner South thirty
 degrees east fifty five chains to a red oak, thence North sixty degrees east thirty six chains
