

370 State of South Carolina, Greenville District; Agreeable to an act of assembly bearing date the 20<sup>th</sup> day of December 1800 I Hudson Berry one of the Justices of the Quorum being informed by Benjamin Arnold that he had an intention to Emancipate and free a certain negro named Prince, Pursuant therunto I issued Summons; to five freeholders who attended according, the said slave being present and after asking the said Arnold the Questions on oath prescribed by Law, — Do give the following Certificate (Viz) We do hereby Certify upon the examination of Benjamin Arnold on oath, the owner of a certain Slave named Prince about twelve years old four feet Eight inches high well made, Satisfactory Proof had been given to us that the said Slave is not of bad Character and is capable of gaining a livelihood by honest means, The said Arnold having full authority over said boy until he arrives at the age of Twenty one years. This Indenture made this third day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and seven, between Humphrey Percy of the County of Buncombe State of N. Carolina of the one part and Young Griffin of the district of Greenville and State of South Carolina, of the other part Witnesseth that the said Humphrey Percy for and in consideration of the sum of Seventy Dollars to him in hand paid by the said young Griffin before the sealing signing of these presents, the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged; Hath given granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents do grant sell alien enfeoff confirm unto the said young Griffin a certain piece or parcel of Land situate lying & being in the district of Greenville afores<sup>d</sup> on the waters of Enonce River, bounding on a line north East on John Savages land S. E. on John Turnbous N. W. N. E. & S. W. on Vacant Land — Containing by estimation one hundred acres be the same more or less the same being part of a tract of Land granted to William Savage on the seventh day of May in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven, and Recorded
