 Exors. & admors. to warrant and forever defend all singular the premises unto
 the said Sundry Hodges his heirs & assigns against myself & my heirs, against
 every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or
 any part thereof; Witness my hand and seal this 25th day of April in the year
 of our Lord 1810. and in the thirty fourth year of the Independency of the

 I William Wood of the State and district aforesaid, for and in consideration of the
 sum of Two Hundred dollars, to him in hand paid by Thomas Howard of the district
 aforesaid, the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted bargained, and
 sold, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release convey & confirm unto
 unto the said Thomas Howard his heirs and assigns forever, all that plantation or
 or tract of Land containing one hundred acres of more or less sixty acres being
 granted to Hinchin Holcomb by his excellency Charles Pinckney Esq Governor &
 Commander in Chief bearing date the seventh day of November 1798. the other
 being part of a tract of Land, conveyed from John Davidson to William Wood, from
 William Wood to Thomas Howard, Situate lying & being in the State & district
 aforesaid, on both sides of Bartons fork, of St. Jeger River, bounded by a line running
 S: on Andersons land, N. E. by Savis land the other side by vacant Land, the above
 mentioned part of Land conveyed from John Davidson to William Wood, Beginning
 on a w: oak, thence to a dogwood thence to a Stake, thence to a Stake, on an open
 line
