Know all men by these presents that I John Chaudler late of Greenville District for and in consideration of Two hundred Dollars to me paid by Young Griffin, Have granted bargained sold and released unto the said Young Griffin and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release a plantation or parcel of Land on Wolf Creek a water of Beaverdam Creek in the District of Greenville, Beginning at lightwood stake running thence S 75 W 70 Chain to a stake, thence N 40 W 78 Chain to a Hickory on Clayborn P. Pool, line thence E 10 Chain to a stake on Wood line thence S 27 E 66 Chain with said line to a stake, thence N 63 E 13 Ch. to a stake thence S 41 E to the Beginning corner, Containing by estimation Two hundred and fifty acres the same being part and the last end of a tract of land granted to Samuel Warren by patent bearing date 6th day of November 1786. —

Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances to the S. premises belonging or in any wise appertaining. To Have and To Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Young Griffin and I do hereby warrant and favour defend the said premises unto the said Young Griffin his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and assigns In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 15th day of October in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and ten, and thirty fourth year of American Independence, Signed sealed and delivered in the presence of us, Just, Wm Barry, Robt Nelson - John Chaudler (Jr)
