The State of South Carolina; I know all men by these presents that I John  
Blankinship of Greenville District in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration  
of the sum of Three hundred and fifty dollars to me in hand paid by  
John Harris of the State and district aforesaid; Have granted bargained  
sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release  
unto the said John Harris part of a tract of land originally granted unto  
William Young, situate lying and being in the district and State aforesaid  
on Saluda River, containing one hundred and fifty acres be the  
same more or less, Beginning at the river on a white oak in James Clayton  
Corner thence along the said River N. 26 E. to a poplar corner agreed on  
thence a straight line to a lightwood stump thence to a poplar on the  
branch thence to strike a line fifteen rods E. of a Hickory station  
thence along the said line to a post oak corner thence S. 20 W. 4 1/2 to a  
Black Oak thence South 13. W. 7. 56 to a maple on the said River thence  
up the river to the Beginning; Together with all and singular the rights  
members, hereditaments, and appurtenances, to the said premises, belonging or  
in any wise incident or appertaining; To Have & to Hold all and singular the  
premises before mentioned unto the said John Harris his heirs and assigns forever  
and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors & administrators to warrant  
and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said John  
Harris his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against
