dollars to me in hand paid by Thomas Hooper of the same State and district
of aforesaid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted bargained
and sold, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the
said Thomas Hooper a plantation or tract of Land containing by estimation one
Hundred acres more or less situate in Greenville District on the north side of Arm-
strongs creek, waters of Saluda River and bounded as follows, viz, Beginning on a
chestnut thence a conditional line between s^r Bruce & George Bradley N. to a
Red oak, thence W. to a stake in the original line thence the original line
to the original corner W^m Thurston Corner thence the original line to
Armstrongs creek thence up s^r Creech to the Beginning, Together with all and
singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to said
Premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, To Have & To
Hold all and singular said Land and premises unto the said Thomas Hooper
his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs &c^{ts} and
adm^{rs} to warrant and forever defend all and singular said Land & Premises
unto the said Premises Thomas Hooper his heirs and assigns against myself
and my heirs or any other Person or Persons whatsoever lawfully claiming or to
claim all or any part thereof, Witness my hand and seal this twenty third
day of November one thousand eight hundred and eight, Signed Sealed
and delivered in the presence of us
