I know all men by these presents that I John Clement of the district aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of seventy five Dollars to me paid by John Clark of said district in the State aforesaid, Have granted bargained sold and Released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and Release unto the said John Clark that parcel of Land containing Seventy eight acres more or less. Situated lying "as follows" (Beginning) on the east bank of Saluda River at the mouth of a small branch the second branch below the wagon road at home Clements and then running up said branch to the head of said branch and then a straight conditional line near a east course to a black oak corner being a corner formerly James Moore, a corner of S. land joining Mr. Clark's lands and then bounded by Mr. Clark's land down to S. River near her
