 granted to John Wesley by his excellency Gov. Moultrie on the fourth day of
 September in the year 1786. it being a part of a tract of 500 acres the land to
 conveyed begins on Persimmon, and runs st. 75 E. 9 to a Red oak st. then st. 15 N. 8 to
 Spanish oak then S. 75 N. 18 over branch to a white oak then down said
 branch the various courses to the Beginning corner, the said land has been conveyed
 through different hands down to the said Wallace Jones son including five
