Jewt. for two hundred and eight acres recorded in grant book S. N. 5 page 463  
situate in the state and district aforesaid, on the Reedy fork of Reedy River -  
Beginning on a chestnut tree running S. 40 W. 19 ch. to a red oak thence N. 32 W. 9  
ch. 50 links to a hickory sapl. thence S. 40 W. 35 ch. to a stake thence S. 63 E. 52 ch.  
to a pine, thence N. 29 E. 19 ch. 50 l. to a Red oak thence S. 66 E. 2 ch. 80 links to a  
Red oak thence N. 29 W. 10 ch. 50 links to a red oak thence N. 20 W. 10 ch. to a post  
oak thence N. 70 E. 46 ch. 50 to a black gum thence N. 20 W. 24 ch. 50 to a Post oak  
thence S. 70 W. 46 ch. 50 links to the Beginning containing two hundred and  
Eighty eight acres more or less, including the plantation whereon Richard  
Maddox now lives. Together with all and singular the rights members heredita-  
-ments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise Inci-  
-pient or pertaining. To have & to hold all and singular the premises before  
mentioned unto the said John Alexander his heirs and assigns forever, and I do
