

Run from thence N^o on said line to an ash corner standing on the branch
 in said original line thence W^o on said line to the Beginning - including forty
 acres more or less it being part of a tract of Land originally granted to James
 Harrison and assigned by his excellency W^o Montross the 2^o day of December 1799
 the courses of sixty acres or less to make the aforesaid mentioned Hundreds
 Beginning on ash on the North bank of Baker's creek at a large branch running
 up S^o branch to maple on the S^o side of said branch thence N. 29 E. to a stake
 on the original line then S. 60 East on the original line to a black oak, then
 S. 30 W. 25 to a stake thence to the Beginning, including sixty acres more or less in the
 whole one hundred acres more or less. Together with all and singular the rights
 members and all that appertains the above described land and premises to the
 said John Bohannon his heirs and assigns forever, and the said Benj. Armstrong
 do hereby bind myself my heirs and assigns to warrant and forever defend
 all and singular the land and premises before mentioned unto the said
 John Bohannon his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and assigns
 and from all and every other Person claiming the same or any part thereof
 In Witness whereof I the said Benjamin Armstrong do hereunto set my hand
 and seal this twentieth day of September 1810.
