 Ross of Greenville District for and in consideration of the sum of Five hundred  
 Dollars to me paid by M. Bee & Henning of the district aforesaid have granted  
 bargained sold and Released and by these presents Do grant bargain sell and  
 Release unto the said M. Bee and Henning a tract or parcel of land laying and  
 being in the district of aforesaid on the N<sup>o</sup>. side of S. Pacolet River Beginning at a large  
 wood on the N<sup>o</sup>. side of the river about forty Rods below the mill running nearly a West  
 course with the present fence and by the corner of the old field till it strikes a  
 line running from a blk oak on Bats line N<sup>o</sup>. 31 Ch<sup>r</sup>. 50 Rods to some blk oak  
 saplings on Moses whites line thence N<sup>o</sup>. 72 E. with his line 5 Chains to a maple  
 on the creek thence up the meanders of the creek to a white oak thence N<sup>o</sup>. 70  
 E. 10 Ch<sup>r</sup> to a post oak thence N<sup>o</sup>. 15 W. 7 Ch<sup>r</sup>. 50 Rods to a post oak thence E. 19  
 Ch<sup>r</sup>. 50 links to an ash on the old still house branch thence down the  
 meander of the branch to an ash on the south side of the River, Ropes beginning  
 corner, thence up the meander of the river as it now runs to the Beginning —  
 Containing by estimation Eighty acres be the same more or less the same being of  
 part of the tract of land granted to John Gowen & the principle and greater  
 part of which is out of one bearing date 21<sup>st</sup> January 1785. wherein I the said  
 Ross now live, also one other tract or parcel of land joining the above, and  
 Beginning at the above mentioned saplings and running a west course with  
 Moses whites line to his corner thence with Willm S. Brown to John Whittens  
 line thence with his line to Robert Gordons line thence with his line to  
 John Bates line thence with his line to a black oak his corner and then  
 North to the beginning, containing one hundred acres be the same more  
 or less the same being part of a tract granted to William Clayton —  
 Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances  
 belonging or in any wise appertaining, To Have and To Hold the above mentioned
