State of South Carolina, I know all men by these presents that I John Brasher of Greenville District and State afores. In consideration of the sum of Two hundred and fifty Dollars Paid by Christopher Jackson of State afores. Have granted and by these presents doth sell and release to S. Christopher Jackson, one hundred acres of land more or less lying in Greenville district on the north side of Reedy River being part of a tract of five hundred and forty acres originally granted to Lewis Duwall by his Excellency Mr. Moultrie the 31st of May 1786 as by the original plat and grant will appear this part being laid out to said Christopher Jackson as follows, Beginning on a felled black oak on the N. bank of Reedy River at Duwall's ford running thence up bounding on said River to a pine corner thence N. 8 chains to a pine thence W. to said River thence up said River to Saml. Pils line from thence Eastward N. 22 on S. Pils line to corner on a red oak thence S. 52 E. to a pine corner thence Westward on a conditional made between John Brasher & Henner Hudson to the beginning including one hundred acres of land more or less Together with all and singular that appertains to said premises before mentioned to the said Christopher Jackson his heirs & assigns forever. I John Brasher doth hereby bind myself my heirs and assigns to warrant & defend the above Described land and premises to the said Christopher Jackson his heirs
