Easley the widow of Millington Easley deceased of Hickman County State of Tennessee  
in consideration of four hundred Dollars to me paid by John Blasingame of Greenville district  
and State of South Carolina. Have granted bargain sold and released and by these presents  
do grant bargain sell and release unto the said John Blasingame all that plantation  
or tract of land containing one hundred and forty acres, situated in Greenville District  
and State aforesaid, Beginning on Saluda river on a red oak corner running N. 41 W. 41 7/8  
to a red oak + thence N. 52 E. 30 to a post oak + thence S. 55 E. 20.50 to a stake on a  
small creek, thence down said creek to a red oak + thence S. 35 W. 10 to a stake + on said creek  
thence down said creek with its meanders to the beginning on said river at the mouth  
of said creek adjoining Henry Paris's land on the East and John Blasingame's land on  
all other sides it being my Dower of the tract of land whereon Millington Easley  
deceased last lived, Together with all and singular the rights members here ditaments  
and appurtenances to the said belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining.

To have & To Hold all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said  
John Blasingame his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs  
Executors & Administrators to warrant and forever defend all singular the said premises unto
