I know all men by these presents that we Joseph Langston of Logan County  
 Kentucky, James Ritchey of Livingston County Kentucky, and John Nichol of  
 Warren County Kentucky for and in consideration of the sum of forty dollars  
 already paid (to the said Joseph Langston) by Elias Earle for George W. Earle of  
 Greenville District and State of South Carolina: We have granted bargained sold  
 and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said  
 George W. Earle his heirs and assigns forever Ten acres of land situate lying and being  
 in Greenville District in the State of South Carolina near Greenville Courthouse being  
 part of a tract of thirty acres of Land Originally granted to the said Langston, Ritchey,  
 and Nichol by grant bearing date the sixth day of December 1790, the part now  
 conveyed to begin on a stake on the north line of the original Survey (being the 3<sup>d</sup>  
 corner of a tract of ten acres heretofore sold off to Samuel Earle) running thence  
 S. 53. N. 13. 50 with said S. Earle, line to his other corner on the opposite original line  
 (being his 2<sup>d</sup> corner) thence with said last mentioned original line S. 55 E. about  
 nine chains, or far enough to include the ten acres by turning parallel  
 with the first line across the original tract, to wit, N. 53 E. untill it strikes  
 the first original line that was begun on thence with said line about nine chain  
 N. 45 W. to the beginning stake corner. Together with all and singular the rights  
 members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any  
 wise incident or appertaining, To Have & to hold all and singular the said premises unto  
 the said George W. Earle his heirs and assigns forever. And we do hereby bind ourselves  
 and each and every of our heirs Executors & Administrators to warrant and forever  
 defend all and singular the said premises unto the said George W. Earle his heirs and  
 assigns against ourselves and our heirs and every other person or persons whomsoever  
 lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof - Witness our hands  
 and seals this fifteenth day of August AD. 1810 -
