A Deed of Gift of Land, goods & Chattels. To all people unto whom this present writing shall come; I Henry Cannon of South Carolina & Greenville District send greeting, know ye that I the said Henry Cannon for divers good causes & valuable considerations, mo herunto moving, have given and granted and by these presents, do give grant and confirm unto Jesse Cannon of the State aforesaid and district of Edgefield, alband singular my two tracts of Land herein after named being part of different tracts originally granted to John Thomas Jun: Viz, three hundred and nine acres known by the name of Milford including the plantation whereon the said Henry Cannon now lives, together with the grist saw Mills and Cotton Machine the land being part of different tracts conveyed by Henry Cannon unto the said Jesse Cannon also two hundred and seventy two acres part of a survey of one thousand acres granted John Thomas Jun: and by Henry Cannon conveyed to Jesse Cannon. Together with all and singular the rights, members Hereditaments, and appurtenances to the said Premises, also three negro Slaves one named Nathan aged thirty three or four, Fanny aged about twenty eight and Shiminee about fifteen years old, also seven head of cattle fifty head of hogs four feather beds together with all and singular my household and kitchen furniture, To Have & To hold all and singular the said Land negroes, Cattle Hogs, household and kitchen furniture whatsoever of me the said Henry Cannon unto the said Jesse Cannon son of Henry Cannon his Executor, administrators and assigns from henceforth to his own proper use and uses thereof & therewith to do order and dispose at his will and pleasure as of his own good and Chattels freely and peaceably and quietly without any manner of let trouble or denial of me the said Henry Cannon or any other person or persons whatsoever of all which premises goods & Chattels I the said Henry Cannon have put the said Jesse Cannon in full & peaceable possession by virtue hereof. In Witness whereof I the said Henry Cannon have herunto set my hand and seal this 17th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and twelve, and in the thirty sixth year of the sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America.
