 State of South Carolina, This Indenture made the sixteenth day of July
 in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and twelve, between
 William Bowen & Horatio Griffin one the one part, and John & Charles Bulow
 of the other part. Witnesseth that the said William Bowen & Horatio Griffin
 for and in consideration of Ten shillings current money of this State to them in
 hand paid and truly paid by the said William Bowen & Horatio Griffin, at and
 before the sealing and delivery hereof the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 hath bargained and sold and by these presents hath bargained and sell unto
 the said John & Charles Bulow their Executors administrators and assigns, Certain
 Plantations or tracts of Land, to wit, a tract of land situate on Bonyh Creek
 Originally granted to George & Mary Lewis in the years 1795 & 1796. Containing two
 hundred and Eleven acres, also another tract lying on Maple creek originally
 granted to Charles Pope & Brift containing two hundred and sixteen acres, also
 another tract situate on both sides of Guilders creek originally belonging to Doct.
 Shelton and conveyed through different hands to Pleasant Sullivan containing
 one hundred acres, also another tract on Princes Creek originally granted to
 George Saunders containing two hundred acres, also another tract situate on the waters
 of Maple creek being a part of two tracts originally granted to James Seaborn in the
 year 1788 sum the 2^d containing one hundred acres, also another tract on the waters of
 Laurel creek whereon Doct. Shelton lived containing two hundred acres, also another
 tract on the north side of Guilders creek originally granted to James Porel containing
 sixty six acres, also another tract situate on the south side of Guilders creek being the
 tract
