sold and delivered unto the said E. K. Earle a Negro girl named Mary, about sixteen years of age
of a dark complexion, being the same girl which I lately sold at Sheriff's sale as the property of
Julius Nichols, by virtue of an execution issued from the Clerk's Office of said district, against
said Nichols; and purchased by James Benson, and sold by said Benson to me the said Wood -
Humbly warranting the said girl to be sound healthy and sensible, and a slave for life - and
will defend the said negro girl & her future increase unto the said Elinor K. Earle her
heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs, and every other person or persons
whomsoever - Witness my hand and seal this twenty first day of November Anno Domini 1812

said David Johnson Goodlett, all my Lands lying on the South side of Richland Creek
it being part of two tracts of land one originally granted to myself, and what I bought
of Levi Howell containing the Plantation whereon Jesse Goodlett now lives, supposed
to contain one hundred and eighty acres, be the same more or less, Together with all
and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in
any wise incident or appertaining, To have and to hold all and singular the premises before
mentioned unto the said David Johnson Goodlett, his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby
bind myself my heirs or executor and administrators to warrant and for ever defend all & singular the
premises before mentioned unto the aforementioned David Johnson Goodlett his heirs and assigns
against myself my heirs and assigns, and against every other person or persons whomsoever
