State of South Carolina. I now all men by these Presents that I Abraham Thomas M. Cool of Greenville district in the State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars paid by Charles Brane of district and State aforesaid have granted bargain sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Charles Brane all that tract or parcel of land containing four hundred & twenty acres (be the same more or less) being the whole of the said tract granted to the said Abraham T. M. Cool Situate in Greenville district on Thompsons branch dam Creek and branches thereof being waters of the middle fork of Tige river - Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to said tract belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Charles Brane his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors & assigns to Warrant and forever defend all & singular the s<sup>d</sup> premises unto the said Charles Brane his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and against all other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming the same. Witness my hand & seal the fourth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nine, & thirty third of American Independence.
