W. 30 Ch. to a post oak thence N. 81. W. 27. Ch. 20 links to a chestnut thence N. 35. W. 17. Ch. to a Spanish oak thence N. 87. E. 25 Ch. to a pine sapling thence N. 81. E. 11 Ch. to a pine thence N. 59. E. 31 Ch. 50 links to a red oak & the creek thence S. 20. E. 13 Ch. 50 links to a Post oak thence S. 8. E. 8. Ch. to a post oak thence S. 58. W. 10 Ch. to a red oak on the branch of the creek thence down the several meanders of the creek to the begining containing by estimation one hundred and thirty acres be the same more or less the same being part of two tracts of Land Granted to John Gowan the one that contains the greater part bearing date October 8<sup>th</sup> 1791. and by him conveyed to Nathan Morgan and by S.
