 Black Oak, thence N. 8 E 29 chain to a Spanish Oak thence thence S. 82 E. 9 ch. to a
 Oak, thence N. 74 E. 4 ch. to a Stake thence S. 8 E 26.50 ch. to a Hickory, thence N. 21.50 ch.
 to the beginning, Containing by estimation forty seven acres and half - be the same more or
 less, being the S. end of a survey granted to Reuben Barwell. Together with all and singular the
 premises before mentioned unto the said Elijah Dill, To have and to hold the same
 to him, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs, executor and administrators to warrant &
 defend the premises before mentioned unto the said Elijah Dill his heirs and assigns against
 all persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. In Witness where
