


Gospel of god that he was present and saw George Salmon sign seal and deliver  
and acknowledge the within deed to Boley Connor for the use and purpose in it  
mentioned and that William H. Salmon was a subscribing witness with himself  
to the due execution of the same sworn to and subscribed before me this 6<sup>th</sup> day  
of November 1813. George Russell. S.P. Warranted the 6<sup>th</sup> Nov 1813 W<sup>m</sup> Salmon.

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The State of South Carolina. Know all men by these presents That I Boley Connor of the  
State of Georgia Franklin County In consideration of Eighty Dollars to me paid by  
Charles Avery of the District of Greenville and State first mentioned have granted  
bargained sold and released and by these presents grant bargain sell and release  
unto the said Charles Avery Senior all that plantation or tract of land containing  
one hundred and fourteen acres, be the same more or less situate in Greenville  
District lying on mountain Creek waters of Saluda River Beginning at a post  
oak 3x running thence N. 80 E. 59.00 to a post oak 3x Bounding on Beale's land  
thence south 28.00 to a stake 3x Bounding on Brown's land thence N. 80. W. 56.00  
to a post oak 3x bounding on the said Charles Avery Senior thence N. 10. W. 11.00 to  
the Beginning. Being part of a tract of land containing one thousand acres originally  
granted to William Woods on the first day of May 1786 and Conveyed by George  
Salmon Executor of the said W<sup>m</sup> Woods to the aforesaid Boley Connor by deed dated  
the Thirtieth day of May 1813. Together with all and singular the rights thereunto  
belonging hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any  
wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the pre-  
mises before mentioned unto the said Charles Avery his heirs and assigns forever and  
I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and protect  
defend all and singular the said premises against myself my heirs and against  
every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any  
part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this nineteenth day of May in the year of  
our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen and in thirty seventh  
year of the Independence of the United States of America. Signed sealed
