State of South Carolina, Know all men by these Presents that I Reuben Smith of Greenville District in the State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of three hundred and forty dollars to me paid by David Vaughn of Greenville District in the state aforesaid have granted bargain'd sold and released and by these presents do grant Bargain sell and release unto the said David Vaughn a certain plantation or tract of Land containing one hundred and fifty acres. Except Fifty acres of the said tract of Land more or less sold to Moses Kemp by Ebenezer Souel. Said Ebenezer and fifty acres of Land was granted to Michael Johnson for Daniel Bennett the first day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Eighty seven, being on Brushy Creek on both sides on south side of Enoree River also a certain plantation or tract of Land adjoining the shore & iscribed tract of Land containing Thirty acres more or less being a part of Fifty acres of a tract of Land originally granted to Reuben Smith the Thirty first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety three, Being on the small branch of Brushy Creek of Enoree the s.a. Thirty acres was taken from a part of Fifty acres granted to Reuben Smith which will appear by a line laid out for that purpose Beginning at Stephens Smiths corner on a hickory S. W. From thence E. to William Smiths corner on a Red oak, from thence N. to Benson road including ten acres of Land on the N. side of said road, the said ten acres are taken from a certain tract of Land deeded to Reuben Smith by A. M. Gilbert 25th Day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and Three the said road to be the dividing line between William Smith and the said Vaughn from where it commences the road to a post oak corner, N. E. together with all and singular the Rites members hereditaments and appertinances to said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all singular the premises before mentioned to the said David Vaughn his heirs and assigns Forever.
