Know all men by these presents that Wilson Cobb, of Greenville District and State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Thirty six dollars to me in hand, have this day granted bargained & sold and by these presents do grant Bargain & sell & release unto George Pouge a part of a tract of Land granted to said Wilson Cobb containing sixty acres more or less situate in district and state aforesaid, and bounded as follows, beginning at a post oak corner, and running South 25° W. 80 to a black oak corner thence S. 70° W. 17 to a pine stump, thence N. 34° W. 41. 80 to a stake, thence S. 60° E. 17. 50 to the beginning post oak. together with all & singular the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining thereto, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs &c to warrant & forever defend all & singular the above described tract of Land unto the said George Pouge his heirs &c forever, and against my heirs and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this fifth day of March in the Year of our Lord 1814, and in the Thirty Eighth Year of the American Independence —
