-nty of Har den, hath for and in consideration of Two Hundred dollars to
me paid by Capt. George Grace of Greenville County & State of S. Carolina
have granted bargain sold & released and by these presents do grant bargain
sell and release unto the said George Grace part of a tract of Land originally
granted to M^{rs}. Neal for 640 acres, then conveyed to Daniel Jackson, then
from said Jackson to S^r. Brunk now from S^r. Brunk to said Grace part
of the tract, beginning at M^{rs}. Stones line on a red oak running near a West
course to a chestnut on Lewis Williams line, then down said line to a hickory
thru up and across Mountain Creek to Jonathan Stones line on a white oak,
then down the meanders of the creek to a red oak at the mouth of a branch,
then crossing the creek with Jonathan Stones line to William Stones line then to the
beginning supposed to include seventy six acres be the same more or less situate
in the said County of Greenville Both sides of Mountain Creek waters of Salsuda
river. together with all and singular the Rights members hereditaments and
appurtenances to the S^r. premises belonging or in any wise incident or appu-
-taining to have and to hold all & singular the premises before mentioned
unto the said George Grace his heirs & assigns forever. and I do hereby
bind myself my heirs Executor and administrators to warrant and forever
defend all and singular the S^r. premises unto the said George Grace his
heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and every person under them
lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, Witness my hand
and seal this 17th day of March in the Year of our Lord one thousand
seven hundred and ninety nine and in the Twenty fourth Year of the
