E. 35° 50' to a rock  $\frac{1}{2}$  bounding on Hockerty Bristers land thence S. 83° 22'. 00 to a small black oak  $\frac{1}{2}$  thence S. 43° 25'. 00 to a stake  $\frac{1}{2}$  bounding on the said Thompson Brister land thence N. 83° W. 64'. 00 Bounding on James Hollands land to the begining together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appertinences to the said premises belonging or in any <sup>wise</sup> incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Samuel Brister his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant & forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Samuel Brister his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against every other person whosoever lawfully claiming or to
