State of South Carolina I know all men by these Presents that I John Loveliss of the State aforesaid and Greenville district for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and sixty dollars to me in hand paid by James Taylor of Greenville district and State aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released unto the said James Taylor, all that tract of land containing Fifty acres, more or less situate lying and being in Greenville district on the north side of Little Horse Creek bounded on the South side by Henry Barrows land, on the West side by Jacob Nabor land on the North side by Rogers Savory and on the east by Harris Mullins land being part of a tract of land granted to Wm Story and conveyed by said Story to James Chastain, and conveyed by said Chastain to Harris Mullins, reserving being thence had it may lawfully appear, to have and to hold all and singular the premises byfoe mentioned unto the said James Taylor his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said James Taylor his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against any other person or persons whom ever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this tenth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and five, and the third year of the American Independence.
