 W. O. 34 N. H. Cooke, 34, thence N. 55 E. to a Stake on a conditional line which separates the land
 from John Looch, thence along the said line to the beginning. Together with all and singular the
 premises before mentioned unto the said Cooke and his heirs forever. And I do hereby bind my
