And we do here by bind ourselves our heirs, executors, & administrators to warrant and forever defend all & singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Rowland Tarrant his heirs and assigns, against ourselves, and heirs forever. E. ~~44~~ — 26, 75 to a hickory thence N. E. 58 — 11, 80 to a Poplar, thence N. E. 45 — 18, 70 to a red Oak, thence S. E. 45. 31, 70 to a Stake on said branch thence down said branch with its meandering to the beginning, — butting and bounding on the North East on Land of John Charles North West on Land of Julius Huff — South West on Land of the Estate of John Tarrant
