


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State of South Carolina. Know all men by these presents that I William Ayres of Greenville  
district and State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred & eighty seven  
dollars to me paid by Samuel J. Alston of said district, have granted bargained sold &  
released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Samuel  
J. Alston all that Plantation or Tract of land Situate in the district aforesaid, on the South  
Side of brushy Creek of Keedy river, Beginning on a black Gum, near the bank of S.  
Creek, thence N. 70 E. 13. 50 to a white oak, Hunt's Corner; thence N. 45 E. 19 to a  
black Jack, thence S. 60 E. 26 to a Stake near a branch of Brushy Creek, thence down  
the various meanders of said Creek to its Confluence near the black gum Corner.  
Containing one hundred & twenty five acres, more or less, Together with all & singu-  
lar the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises before  
mentioned, to the said Samuel J. Alston his heirs and assigns forever. and I do hereby  
bind myself my heirs Executors & Administrators to warrant & for ever defend all &  
singular the said premises, unto the said Samuel J. Alston his heirs and assigns against  
myself & my heirs, & against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim  
the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this 26<sup>th</sup> day of May in the  
year of our Lord 1814, and in the 37<sup>th</sup> & 38<sup>th</sup> year of the Independence of the United
