

State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents that I Blackman Ligon Son of Greenville District in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of three Hundred dollars to me in hand paid by John J Ligon of Greenville District and State aforesaid, Have granted bargained sold and released & by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said John J Ligon One Hundred and twenty four acres of land lying on Saluda River to the same more or less which was granted by his Excellency William Montross unto William Benson the 5th day of June 1766 as appears by a grant Recorded in the Secretarys Office in Grant Book N. N. N. N. page 713 beginning on a corner Holly on a Branch thence down the Branch 20 chains to the River thence up the river as it meanders to a corner on a Crab apple tree thence S 75 E 16.2 to a Hickory corner thence S. 7 W 48 to the beginning Holly corner together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining To have and to hold all and singular the premises aforesaid unto the said John J Ligon his Heirs and assigns for ever and I do hereby bind myself my Heirs Executors and administrators to Warrant and for ever defend all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said John J Ligon his Heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and against every other person ^{whomsoever} lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. as witness my hand and Seal this Eleventh day of March One thousand Eight Hundred and Fifteen

E 95 on William Cokers line to the beginning It being part of a tract of Eight Hundred and forty two acres of land originally granted
