I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors & administrators to warrant & forever defend all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said James Dickerson his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs or any other person having any lawful claim on the same or any part thereof. Know all men by these presents that I James Dickerson of the State and district aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Samuel Williams of the State and district aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Samuel Williams a plantation & tract of land wherein James Dickerson now lives, containing two hundred acres, to the sum more or less, lying on the North east side of the Golden Grove Creek, on the booring mill branch, beginning on a Poplar corner ¹³ from thence down the main Grove Creek to a Chingupon corner ³⁴ at Ambrose Blackburns old bridge, from thence along the line South East, from thence up the hollow to the waggon road by the meeting house to where John Bowie's line crosses s^o road from thence along s^o Bowie's line N.E. to a Stake corner, from thence a straight line to a Stone corner on the booring mill branch N.E. from thence S.W. down s^c branch to the fork, from thence a conditional line marked N.W. to the begining corner. granted by his excellency William Moultrie Esq; on the 1st day of May 1786.
