do hereby certify unto all whom it may concern that Ellinora Blasingame  
the wife of the within named Buckley Blasingame, did this day appear before  
me and upon being privately and separately examined by me, did declare  
that she does freely voluntarily and without any compulsion dread or fear  
of any Person or Person, who has or ever renounced release and forever relinquish  
unto the within named Samuel Richards his heirs and assigns all her interest  
and Estate also all her right and claim of dower of in or to all her singular  
the premises within mentioned and released; Given under my hand & seal  
this twenty third day of September Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred  
and fifteen. In witness whereof John Gowan J.P. - Ellinora Blasingame  
South Carolina Greenville District. Personally came John Gowan Esqur  
before me the subscriber of Justice and being duly sworn maketh oath  
that he saw Buckley Blasingame sign seal and deliver the within  
deed of conveyance to Samuel Richards for the use and purpose therein  
mentioned and that William West was a subscribing witness to the same  
sworn to this 12<sup>th</sup> day of August A.D. 1816.

John Blasingame and Samuel Townes of the district & state aforesaid  
Executors of William Mathers deceased for and in consideration of the  
sum of four hundred and one dollars to us in hand paid by John  
Harris of the district and state aforesaid have granted bargained  
sold and Relased and by these presents do grant bargain sell  
and release unto the said John Harris all that tract or parcel of  
land lying and being in the district aforesaid on the water of  
Saluda River, Containing one hundred and seventy one acres be  
the same more or less Beginning on a black oak running thence S. 50° W.  
26. 25 to a post oak thence S. 20° W. 29. 40 to a post oak thence N. 75° W. 14. 50  
to a poplar thence S. 20° W. 8 to a pine stump thence N. 45° W. 20 to a poplar  
thence S. 26° W. 35 to a stake thence N. 70° W. 8. 75 to a Red oak thence N. 20°  
W. 4. 50 to a red oak thence S. 70° E. 40 to a stake thence East by chain  
and twenty seven links to the Beginning, which said tract of land was  
originally granted to William Young and by him conveyed to the said  
William Mathers late deceased, Together with all land singular the  
rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises  
belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and  
to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said  
John Harris his heirs and assigns forever, and we do hereby bind  
ourselves as Executors aforesaid to warrant and forever defend all and  
singular the said premises unto the said John Harris his heirs and  
assigns against ourselves and our heirs and against every other Person or  
Person whosoeva lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any  
part thereof. Witness our hands and seal, this Eighth day of  
August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred  
and sixteen, and in the forty first year of the American
