 eight hundred and sixteen.

 parcel or Tract of land supposed to contain twenty five acres be the same more
 or less, being part of a tract of land originally granted to Joseph Langston
 Situate in the district and State aforesaid on the waters of Kedy River at the foot
 of Paris's Mountain adjoining said Bridges said Beginning at a Chestnut corner
 made by said Bridges and comes on the lower line of the old Survey at a small branch
 turning thence along said old line N. 63 West to the old original corner near
 Bridges' field, thence an Eastwardly course along an other old line of the
 said Survey to another original corner of said Survey, — thence along another
 original line of said Survey, a South eastwardly course, until it strikes the
 main hollow which forms the branch first began on, thence down the meanders
 of the branch to the beginning Chestnut: Together with all and singular the
