thence N. 25 W. 23. ch. & 50 links to a Post oak, thence S. 66. E. 31 ch.
to a Stake thence E. 7 ch. & 50 links to the beginning, containing
thirty two acres, all the above described lands adjoining each
other, and containing two hundred and ninety nine acres
more or less, together with all and singular the rights mem-
bers hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises
belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, unto the
said Street Thurston and his Heirs for ever, and I do hereby
bind myself my Heirs Executors Administrators &c. to warrant
and forever defend the above described premises from me & my
Heirs & from every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming

min Turner of the State and district aforesaid have granted bargain
sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and
release unto the said Benjamin Turner one moiety or part of a
tract of land, supposed to be one hundred and fourteen acres more or less
the same being granted to Peter Franman and Francis Bremer on the
sixth day of March 1785, by his Excellency William Moultrie Esq.
