This Indenture made this 18<sup>th</sup> day of April in Year one thousand Eight hundred and ten, between Martin Connor of Greenville district and State of South Carolina of the one part, and John Steed of the same district and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesses that the said Martin Connor for & in consideration of the just sum of four hundred dollars to him paid by the said John Steed the receipt whereof the said Martin Connor doth hereby acknowledge, & hath granted bargained & sold, & by these Presents doth bargain & sell unto the s<sup>d</sup> John Steed his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract of land, Situate lying & being in the district afores<sup>d</sup> on the parting ridge between the waters of Enoree & reedy river, Containing one hundred acres of land more or less, & bounded as follows, viz, beginning on a red oak Corner bounded on others Bates land, thence along the original line an East course to a conditional Corner made on a gum between Moses Bates and Martin Connor, thence along the s<sup>d</sup> line to Moses Bates, old line, thence along the s<sup>o</sup> line, South Course to a red oak Corner, thence a West course to a fork of a branch, thence along said branch to a Persimmon Corner thence a West course, a conditional line made between Andrew Cooksey and Enock Cooksey to a black Jack corner then a straight line a North Course to a Chestnut corner thence down a branch to a fork, thence up the fork to the head of the branch on a Pine Corner made between Martin Connor and John Bates, thence north to a Lightwood Corner at the edge of the old field, thence the conditional line to a lightwood Corner of John Bates,
