



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in said district of Greenville & State of S. C. I do hereby authorize

South Carolina. And do hereby give full effect to all such
acts as my said agent may perform in my name; giving
them as full & complete operation, as if done by myself in

this Power of Attorney made to his son William Robinson
to be his act and deed for the purposes therein mentioned
