The State of South Carolina Greenville District, Know all men by these presents that I Enoch Benson of Greenville District in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of two thousand dollars to me paid by Polly Jenkins of the State and district aforesaid, have granted bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Polly Jenkins a plantation or tract of Land lying and being situate in the district and State aforesaid on both sides of the Beaver dam Creek a branch of Enoree river, it being a part of several tracts of land, with a whole tract, granted to Thomas Farrow, the land to be conveyed begins at Post Oak Corner on Clayborn P. Pauls land thence northwardly 20 c. 20 l. on said Jenkins line to a Red Oak Corner, thence said course a conditional line to a Hickory Corner, on Samuel Stiles line, thence Westwardly on an open line to binding on said Stiles to a black Jack Corner thence Southwardly on Stiles and Elisha Greens lines to a red Oak Corner, thence binding on said Greens line to the following different corners, first Eastwardly to a Post Oak Corner, thence Southwardly to a Post Oak x, thence Eastwardly to a Post Oak x thence Southwardly to a Post Oak x, thence Southwardly to the bank of said Beaver dam Creek to a bunch of sweet wood, thence up the different meanders of said Creek to the mouth of a branch,
