Containing by estimation Ninety nine acres, more or less. Together
with all and singular the rights members hereditaments appurtenances
to the said premises belonging; or in any wise incident or appertaining; To
have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the
said William Christopher his heirs and assigns forever. And I do
hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant &
forever defend all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the
said William Christopher his heirs and assigns "against" myself my
heirs executors administrators and assigns, and against all and singular the
claim of every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to

to William Reed for 691 acres, and signed by Governor Pinckney
on the 2nd day of March 1792, laying in the State and district aforesaid
on the waters of Saluda River, begining on a Post Oak and
running N. 10 ch. to a Post Oak, thence N. 45 E. 37 to a red Oak Sapling
thence N. 45 W. 10 to a Stake, thence N. 70 E. 38.50 to a post Oak thence
S. 53 E. 31. to a White Oak, thence to Peter Ackers line & on sd line unto
Jure Clark's line, thence to the beginning corner including two hundred &
eighty eight acres, be the same more or less. Together with all and
singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances thereto
belonging or any wise appertaining or incident to said premises.
