And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors or Adm'c'nt'rs to warrant & defend the above mentioned premises "unto the" the said Robert Goodgion his heirs or Assigns against me and my heirs and against every person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and 113. of American Independence. Know all men by these presents that I John Green of Greenville district in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of two hundred and sixty dollars to me paid by William Cunningham of Greenville district in the State aforesaid, have granted bargained sold & released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said William Cunningham all that tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and three acres, be the same more or less lying and being in the state and district aforesaid, on both sides of Apple creek, water of Enoree river being a part of a tract of land originally granted unto Margaret Cook, beginning on a sweet gum corner at the mouth of a branch, being a dividing line between the land to be conveyed & Joshua Cox's land, thence running up the branch following the meanders to a maple corner, on a line of land laid out for George Saunders, thence \$55L twenty two chains to a Hickory corner old marked, thence \$25 W. thirteen chains 23 links to a Post Oak corner old marked, thence N. 69 W. 55 links to a White Oak corner on the upper bank of a spring, thence through the middle of the spring, and down the spring branch following the meanders to the aforesaid Apple creek, thence down said creek following the meanders to an ash corner, on
