State of South Carolina Greenville district. Know all men by these  
presents that I Jesse Robins of the district and State aforesaid for  
and in consideration of four hundred dollars to me in hand paid  
by Amos Richardson of the State and district aforesaid have granted  
bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain  
sell and release unto the said Amos Richardson a plantation tract  
or parcel of land containing one hundred and fifty acres more or  
less it being part of two tracts of land in the state and district  
aforesaid one of them originally granted to William Haden containing  
one hundred acres signed by his excellency W. Moultrie on the first day  
of December in the year of our Lord 1785 and has since been conveyed  
down through different hands to the said Jesse Robins the said land to  
be conveyed is fifty acres more or less beginning on a white oak at the  
mouth of a branch on the north side of the Needy Fork of Needy River  
from thence S. E. course to the original line thence along said line N 40  
to red oak thence S 50 W to the said Needy Fork of Needy River thence  
down the said fork to the Beginning. The other a part of a tract of  
land lying on the waters of Needy River containing 232 acres originally  
granted to Land. Boling signed by his excellency W. Moultrie on the  
4<sup>th</sup> day of September 1786 and has since been conveyed down through  
different hands to said Jesse Robins the said land to be conveyed is one
