129 State of Alabama Jefferson County. This Indenture made this fifth day
of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twenty
between Thomas Tarrant of the County and State aforesaid of the one part and Carter
Tarrant of the District of Greenville and State of South Carolina of the other part.
Witnesseth, that the said Thomas Tarrant for and in consideration of the sum of
three thousand eight hundred and fifty dollars to him in hand paid by the
said Carter Tarrant before the sealing and delivery of these presents the
receipt whereof the said Thomas Tarrant doth hereby acknowledge, he
the said Thomas Tarrant hat granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed,
-ed, and confirmed, and by these presents doth bargain sell, alien, convey
and confirm, unto the said Carter Tarrant his heirs and assigns all that
plantation or tract or parcel of land, situate, lying and being in the district
of Greenville and state of South Carolina on the Golden Grove creek
waters of Saluda river, being part and parcel of the lands owned & possessed
by Larkin Tarrant the elder; at the time of his decease. Beginning at the
mouth of a small branch running up the same to a maple, thence to
another maple, thence to a black oak thence to a dogwood, thence to a
persimmon, thence to a red oak, thence to a stake, thence to a beech, thence
a mulberry being down another small branch thence to a beech thence
to a maple, thence to a gum, thence to a hickory, thence to an iron,
thence to a white oak, thence to a water oak on the creek, thence
down the creek to an ash at the beginning containing two hundred and
twenty acres, and hath such shape, form, marks, meets, and bounds as
are represented by a plat hereunto annexed and by which the same will
more fully and at large appear. Together with all and singular the
buildings, improvements, woods, ways, waters, water courses, rights, liberties,
privileges, incidents, and appurtenances, whatsoever thence to belong
or in any wise appertaining, and the reversions and remainders, rents, issues &
profits thereof. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land
as aforesaid described together with all and singular the premises hereby
bargained and sold, or meant, mentioned or intended hereby so to be,
and every part and parcel thereof, with their and every of their
appurtenances unto the said Carter Tarrant his heirs and assigns
forever, and to and for no other use, intent or purpose whatsoever.
