a letter of attorney bearing date the 25 May 1820. duly executed & delivered  
to us by the said Henry Middleton and in pursuance of the within deed of  
bargain and sale do hereby acknowledge to have received from the within  
named George W. Earle the within mentioned sum of eight thousand one  
hundred dollars the consideration money in full, for the negro Slaves men-  
tioned in the within deed and herein after more particularly described  
(to wit): Hector and Binah his wife each 40 years old their children Bob  
about 22, John about 14, Julia their daughter about 12, George their  
son about 10, Joan about 6, Fanny about 3 and Isaac about 4 months  
Amy about 20, and her three children (viz) Binah about 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>, Peggy  
about 3, Siema about 3 months & Peter, Cyrus, Dary, Dowy, & Mandy  
5 men each between 25 & 30 years of age & Molly about 14, Diana  
about 12, Bob (son of Cyrus about 10 & Carpenter Caesar about 30,  
Phoeby his wife about 25, and their 4 children, Beck, Seven, Agrippa  
5, Jude about 3, and Joe about one year old, All which above describe  
Negroe Slaves, with the future increase of the females, we do in virtue of the  
power to us given in the Letter of attorney aforesaid hereby bind the said  
Henry Middleton his executors and administrators to Warrant and defend  
unto the said George W. Earle his heirs executors Administrators & assigns  
for ever. Witness our Hands and seals this 6<sup>th</sup> day of June 1820. at  
Charleston.
