consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars to me in hand paid by
Philip C. Lester of Greenville district & state aforesaid have granted
bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain,
sell, and release unto the said Philip C. Lester a certain plantation
or tract of land containing one hundred acres more or less, situated
in Greenville district & state aforesaid, on the head of Taylors and
Morgan branches, waters of Enoree River, including the spot where
the Greenville & Bancombe roads cross, also where George Culberson
formerly lived, the same being a part of a tract of five hundred acres
originally granted to Henry Hughes Feb 5th 1787. bounding on John
Wheeler, Gipe Morgan, William Taylor, Joseph McLaughlin Beal &
John McDades land. Beginning at Beals red oak corner, near S. E. crook
roads, and runs on said line N 30 E 4 chains to a red oak corner then S 31
E 12 ch^s to a red oak at the Bancombe road, then down said road
