conditional line made between said Langford & Nancy & Sarah
Langford to a black gum thence a straight line to a black oak
near the mouth of a branch thence up said branch to a black
oak John Justices corner thence on his line to a hickory on the
Original line thence on said line to a post oak thence E to a
white oak on the S bank of the river thence N to a hickory thence
S to a post oak thence to the beginning corner. Together with all
and singular the rights, members, incidents, & appurtenments
to the said premises, belonging or in any way appertaining
