Given under my hand & seal this 29th of August 1819 and in forty third year of the Independence of the United States of America

Griffin now lives containing two hundred acres by the same more or less. Beginning at a Spanish Oak thence N 50 W 27 to a white Oak thence N 40 E 44 1/2 to a pine thence S 50 E 17 to a poplar thence N 60 E 25 to a chinut thence S 50 E 18 to a stake from thence to the Beginning the same being granted to John Young Esq. the 4th day of
