

And receded in grant book C page 462 N 5 the land conveyed begins as follows, that is, when the old line crosses the long hollow thence S 12 E 38 to a post oak thence S 58 E 15:50 to a post oak 3x thence N 70 E 35 to a stake 3x thence N 10 W 12 to the muddy branch thence down the said branch to the creek thence up the said creek to the mouth of the aforesaid long hollow thence up said hollow to the beginning, to include 48 acres be the same more or less. Together with all & singular the rights, members, hereditaments & tenements belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining thereto. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Ex<sup>or</sup> adm<sup>r</sup> & assigns, against every person or persons whomsoever claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand & seal this 18<sup>th</sup> day of July 1821. & 45<sup>th</sup> & 46<sup>th</sup> of the Independence of the United States of America. In presence of us.

I know all men by these presents that I Nathan Massey of Laurens district in the state aforesaid for & in consideration of the sum of eighty dollars to me in hand paid by John Parish of Greenville district & state aforesaid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged I have granted, bargained & sold & by these presents do grant, bargain, sell & release unto the said John Parish all that tract or parcel of land containing twenty acres, be the same more or less, situated in the district of Greenville & Laurens & state aforesaid on the N<sup>W</sup> part of Rabun's creek it being part of a tract originally granted to James Swad, the land conveyed, begins on a post oak on John Parish sen<sup>r</sup>'s line thence S 11 W 50 W to a maple on a small branch thence down the said branch to the mouth when it runs into the aforesaid Rabun's creek thence up the said creek to when the said John Parish sen<sup>r</sup>'s line crosses thence on the said line to the beginning, to include twenty acres be the same more or less. Together with all & singular the rights, members, hereditaments, & tenements belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining thereto. I do hereby bind myself my heirs Ex<sup>or</sup> adm<sup>r</sup> & assigns, against every person or persons whomsoever claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
