265 This Indenture made this 23^d day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty between John Watson Sen^r of the one part & Tho^s G Walker of the other part. Witnesseth, that the said John Watson Sen^r for & in consideration of the sum of twenty dollars to him in hand paid by Tho^s G Walker have granted, bargained, & sold & do hereby enjoin & confirm to the said Tho^s G Walker a certain tract tenement or parcel of land containing fifty eight acres more or less lying and being in the district of Sumner state of South Carolina adjoining Captⁿ Isaac Green about three miles from the village of Sumner. Beginning at a poplar 37 waters of Richland creek water of ruddy river surveyed by B Griffith 25th day Sept^r 1820. Running N 74 E 14:50 to a red oak 37 thence N 16 E 15:50 to a stake on Isaac Green's Land on the Sumner road, or road leading to Sumner St. Woods from Spartanburg, thence along said Road to a stake by a Red Oak 37 at the head of the branch, thence down the branch to the fork so as to include the branch & to the beginning so as to include the above fifty eight acres more or less.
