A.D. 1816. Between Thomas M. Carroll Planter of the State and district afores<sup>d</sup>  
of the one part and Jonathan Thompson of S<sup>t</sup> State and district afores<sup>d</sup> Planter of the  
other Part witnesseth that said Thomas M. Carroll for and in consideration of  
the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to him in hand paid by said  
Jonathan Thompson at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the  
receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath given granted sold & released  
and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell and Release unto the  
said Jonathan Thompson his heirs & assigns forever all that part of a  
tract of land whereon George Brock now resides being part of a tract of  
land originally granted to James Tubb & Sons to John White then  
Conveyed by said White to S<sup>r</sup> Brock having such marks and bounda-  
ries as agreed on between S<sup>r</sup> White & Brock Containing Sixty acres, be the  
same more or less situate in the district afores<sup>d</sup> on the waters of Sabuda river  
Beginning on a hickory corner thence to a white oak corner thence down  
a branch joining Thurstons land unto the main branch thence to a gum  
corner thence on same line to a conditional corner agreed on between  
White & Brock thence to a Poplar on another conditional line agreed  
on between the S<sup>r</sup> White & Brock from thence to the beginning corner  
to have and to hold the S<sup>r</sup> tract of land of Sixty acres more or less  
with every appurtenance thereto belonging unto the said Thompson  
his heirs & assigns forever from him the S<sup>r</sup> M. Carroll his heirs & assigns  
forever he the said M. Carroll from his heirs & assigns and from all  
and every other person or persons shall and will warrant & forever
